





The ACT and SAT are tests to evaluate high school students' academic readiness for college, assessing skills in reading, writing, math, and science reasoning in the case of the ACT.

Many colleges including private, public, and state higher ed systems have reinstated the ACT and SAT test requirements for admission. All-Pro Tutoring and Test Prep strongly urge students to prepare for and take the ACT or SAT test.

### Components of the ACT and SAT Tests

**ACT Components:** Reading, Math, Science, Writing & Language

Scoring Scale is 1-36 Points ~ Average score is 21 Points

Approximately 3 hours (Students planning to study STEM course in college should take the ACT test.)

**SAT Components:** Reading, Math, Writing & Language

Scoring Scale is 400-1,600 points ~ Average score is 1,000 points

How long? Approximately 2.25 hours

### **To ensure that you are ready for the ACT/SAT test:**

~ Read Challenging Material *Reading will help improve your scores in all areas.*

~ Complete Practice Tests *We recommend taking 4 practice tests.*

~ Purchase an SAT/ACT book for review

~ Attend a test prep class

~ Private Tutoring and Group Study are beneficial

### 10<sup>th</sup> Grade: Explore & Prepare

#### 1. Academics

- Maintain or improve GPA
- Consider honors or AP courses if appropriate
- Strengthen writing and critical thinking skills

#### 2. Testing

- Take the PSAT
- Identify testing strengths and weaknesses

#### 3. Activities

- Continuing activities; aim for commitment, not quantity
- Look for leadership or service opportunities

#### 4. College Awareness

- Start informal college research (size, location, majors)
- Attend college fairs
